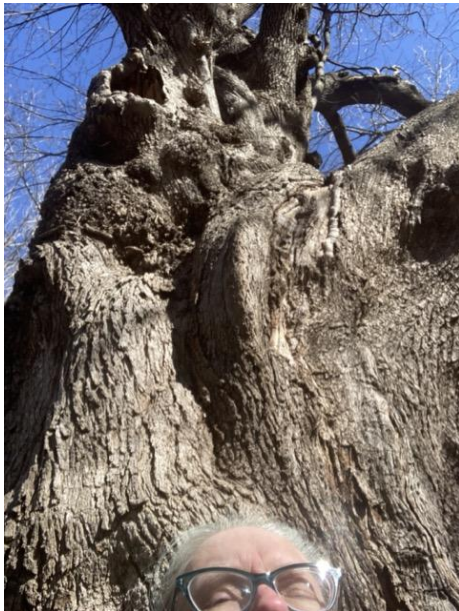

outdoor companionship class learnings...

i have had two sessions of my outdoor companionship classes—and i have much to share already!! my heart is so full of new insights and experiences....but for this moment, let's you and i ****breathe**** (), and i speak to just one of those really powerful moments of seeing.



on the first sunday we met, my class (of 9 students) went outside in the second half of our day. we were led into a forest bathing experience by one of our instructors, phyllis look, the first forest bathing guide in hawai'i. through zoom, phyllis guided us to be wholly present in the moment in our outdoor settings. for me, i was sitting against the base of the norway maple at station 1 in the backwoods. she asked each of us to really experience the moment through our 5 senses, while also including our heart sense and imaginal sense (what we are experiencing beyond our experiences—call it our intuition, perhaps). it was lovely to take the time and really behold and receive the gloriousness of the backwoods!!

then, the next morning, we gathered again on zoom at 6:45a for our first “sit spot”, which i described in last week's midweek email. this was the 2nd day of daylight savings time, and so, at 6:45a, it was still very dark. but, i nestled under my blanket with my cup of coffee on the front porch of my house, and opened my senses with a sense of expectancy. i was surprised by the constant, low-grade rumbling of interstate 94 which i heard, and eventually it was punctuated by an increasing call of song birds. the chilly air did not have much of a smell, but i felt the cold. a handful of dog walkers passed by, and was somewhat surprised that the only wild thing i saw was 1 bird which flew across my line of vision. but, the amidst the stillness of the morning, what i did get to behold within those 35 minutes was the movement of increasing light entering the day. this s...l...o...w rising of the sun, infinitesimal lightening of the

sky, was profound to behold. as i watched the dawning of the light, i had a visceral quieting of my internal body and mind, and i experienced such profound peace and centering.

barely an hour later, i attended a lectio divina prayer group, and this particular morning, psalm 23 was the scripture we prayed. in the practice of lectio divina, you hear a short-ish phrase of scripture, and notice the word or phrase that shimmers and resonates within you. and i heard:

God makes me lie down in green pastures,
And leads me beside still waters;
God restores my soul....
... I fear no evil...

and, it was in this moment, that i saw that, truly, god has been the First Forest Guide. god has been inviting us throughout the ages to lie down in the green pastures and along the water edges, so that we can become present to the peace and love **which is** in this present moment. and, by coming into this present moment, we experience our souls restored, and the absence of fear. god, the healer of our minds and hearts, is here, in this moment, and our sisters and brothers of the forest are ready to share this good news.

what is god inviting you to sit beside today and to be still? perhaps it is to sit by your window and watch the wind blow the crispy brown leaves around. maybe it is to go outside and breathe out your fears and anxieties, and to let go. maybe it is to bring a house plant next to you, and to really see it in all of its gloriousness. the natural world sings of the invitation of god's healing and love. come, friends, let us receive this grace!!

holy spirit, in this holy moment, you be in charge,
and we will follow you, trusting that your direction leads to peace!!

March Mission: Minnesota FoodShare

This month Edgcumbe is collecting funds for the Foodshare Campaign that supports approximately 300 Minnesota food pantries. We are also continuing our support of nearby pantry Francis Basket. Our own food shelf at Edgcumbe gives extra items to this pantry located in the apartment complex across the street from Sibley Plaza on 7th Street.

Here are some more highlights about food insecurity in Minnesota, and **another busy pantry in the Minneapolis Uptown neighborhood: Joyce Uptown Food Shelf**. Joyce Foodshelf has been a fixture in Uptown since 1969.

- **Between 2019 and 2022 the number of individuals served at Joyce went from 12,934 to 32,503. Pounds of food received went from 219,679 lbs to 660,907.**
- Joyce pantry receives Foodshare funds, but to serve this many families they also rely on a large network of volunteers (120) and church and corporate sponsors. Purchased food comes from wholesale food bank partners, and grocery store "recovery" partners.
