### Moment for Missions: Sycamore Trees Needed

This past Sunday, Pastor Phil brought us back to the fascinating story of The Short Rich Tree Climber. Zacchaeus wanted to see Jesus so badly that he did whatever he had to do: get away from the grumbling crowd, and climb up to where he could discover a different perspective. When he got eye to eye with Jesus, everything changed. His core identity as a son of Abraham was proclaimed. His generosity and commitment to justice were blessed. And he got to bring God home for dinner!

Being eye to eye with Jesus changes us. In our Moment for Missions, Elder Eleta announced that the Elders and EPC Missions have decided to financially support our own Angelie Ryah as a missionary with Church Resource Ministries. Angelie reminded us that her central work is to provide "sycamore trees" – resources for faith leaders to reconnect with God so their core identity and calling can be reclaimed. A particular focus is ministry leaders on both sides of the US-Mexico border, where peacemakers are crucially needed. But before Angelie sets out on this mission, her monthly ministry budget of \$5,000 must be met before she can relocate; currently 35% of this goal has been reached.

To help with Angelie's mission, the Elders invite the Edgcumbe family to join them in supporting this work: they will pledge \$10/month of their own money for each new monthly donor who pledges to Angelie by December 10.
