## What Are You Willing to Give Up?

Why do we give up something for Lent? A popular but mistaken idea is that we give something up to increase our suffering and connect to Jesus' suffering—as if suffering itself is redemptive. Amazingly, God can use absolutely anything to bring us healing and love, even suffering! But suffering itself does not have any special or salvific qualities. Mostly it just stinks.

The reason we give up something is to make room to listen to God. In 1 Samuel 13, the prophet Samuel talks to God in every moment, and God gives Samuel all the guidance and help he needs to live with fullness even in the face of fear and failure and success. If we have any chance of hearing God talk to us, we've got to be listening. We asked the congregation last Sunday to list some things they would like to give up this week in order to spend some time listening to God. Here were some of the things individuals offered to give up:

- Sugar
- Comparisons and Judgment
- Social Media
- Focus on politics
- Complaining

Imagine, just for a moment, giving up all comparisons for one hour each day. Every time you feel a comparison arising in your mind, you could say, "God, please show me how you want to see [that person, this situation, that group]?" Or think about taking just a little time off from surfing the web or looking at social media and instead checking with God: "Holy Spirit, what do you want me to spend my time doing right now?" If you spend any time at all talking to and listening to God, then God will respond with grace and power and guidance and love in your life.

## **Special Worship Services**

I suspect that most of you realize that we as a church community are happy to help out with special situations like marriages and funerals. We also celebrate events like baptism, confirmation, becoming a member, ordinations, etc. What I would also like for you to realize is that other services and rituals are available to everyone in this community. Let me give some examples.

- If you are dying, we could have a service of support and celebration of life while you are still alive, so you could join in the reflection and learning and joy.
- If you are sick or hurting in body or soul, we could surround you with prayers in a service of healing.
- If you are going through a big change or transition, we could create a service to mark that change—helping you mourn parts of your life that you are leaving behind and step forward into the next steps.
- If you have a big and difficult decision to make, we could support you with a service of discernment.
- If something is weighing you down, we could celebrate a ritual of confession and forgiveness.

Do you get the idea? Any of these services could be big or small, public or private, with music or without—the possibilities are endless and flexible. One of our goals as a community is to surround each other with honesty and love. If any of these ideas is appealing to you, please talk to Pastor Phil or Pastor Julie.
