FAITH PRACTICE: READING MATTHEW

Our faith practice this week is the ongoing discipline of reading through the book of Matthew. Here are a few tips and suggestions from Pastor Phil.

- 1. Each time you start to read the Bible, say a short prayer asking God to guide your reading and to teach you what you need to learn in that moment.
- 2. Don't be afraid to read to large sections in one sitting--several chapters, for example. One mistake that people make is to read a very short passage and then get caught on one line that doesn't make sense or that bugs them. Let the flow of the book carry you past tricky passages to a larger picture of who Jesus is and what God is doing.
- 3. The heart of the book of Matthew is the "Sermon on the Mount" in chapters 5-7. It is one of the clearest expressions of God's vision for our lives. If reading the whole book is intimidating to you, start with those three chapters.

Our text is from Exodus 1 & 2, the story of the Hebrew midwives and the saving of baby Moses at the beginning the Exodus saga. Fun detail: this text fails to name the most powerful man in the world (the Pharaoh, leading to years of scholarly debate about which Pharaoh this was), but does name the two midwives (Puah & Shiphrah).

After worship, our **guest artist Jinger Markley** will talk about her "100-Day Project" that is currently hanging around the church building.
