Why not just be PRESENT all the time?

Presence is about openness and curiosity and calm and peace and love and connection to ourselves and the Divine. The lack of presence is about internal chaos and confusion and anxiety and being triggered and anger and shame. So why in the world would we not choose presence all the time? Why do we subject ourselves to so much suffering and disconnection? The short answer is because presence might sound appealing but it is amazingly scary. It feels vulnerable, and we have learned not to trust the world and others and even ourselves when we feel so vulnerable.

Our egos have learned an effective way to falsely protect us when we feel this vulnerability. Our egos feed us a three-part lie to keep our hearts closed:

- 1. Our egos tell us that we have no needs--we don't need other people, we don't need help, and we certainly don't need open-hearted presence. We are good good good, thank you very much.
- 2. The second lie our egos tell us is that we are shameful and broken and do not deserve love or connection or happiness. Bouncing us back and forth between these two lies ("I'm too good for this!" and "I'm awful and don't deserve this!") works for most of us for years or decades to keep us from relaxing in the love and peace of real presence.
- 3. When those two lies start to fall apart and we allow ourselves to trust God and ourselves and the people around us for even a moment, then the ego pulls out its trump card. The ego says, "O, you think you can rest in God's love? If you abandon me, your ego (my Godzilla suit, in last Sunday's metaphor), then you will surely die. I am the only thing keeping you alive." Don't brush past this insight too quickly. Take a moment to be honest with yourself about this death-threat within yourself. Recently, I've had the opportunity to record myself talking about the Enneagram or about the Bible, two topics I love. How did my insides respond? I felt scared to death. [Pause, think about that for a moment.] Was this a logical or reasonable response? No. Do I actually love talking about these topics? Yes I do. If I did it, would I actually die? No I would not. Has my unreasonable fear kept me from starting? Yes it has. Phil's Ego 1, Phil 0.

If you are going to attempt more presence in your life, then you need to know that it is a journey to the most beautiful place imaginable, a journey to your own heart. But it is also a journey that takes fortitude and grace and perseverance and self-awareness and honesty. When the Apostle Paul says, May the mind of Christ be within you, he is giving us the gift of thinking God's thoughts rather than the thoughts of our own egos.

Holy Spirit, in this holy moment, you be in charge, and I will follow you, trusting that your direction will lead to peace.

Text for Sunday, May 17:

Acts 17:22-31 Paul speaks in Athens

22 Paul stood up in the middle of the council on Mars Hill and said, "People of Athens, I see that you are very religious in every way. 23 As I was walking through town and carefully observing your objects of worship, I even found an altar with this inscription: 'To an unknown God.' What you worship as unknown, I now proclaim to you. 24 God, who made the world and everything in it, is Lord of heaven and earth. He doesn't live in temples made with human hands. 25 Nor is God served by human hands, as though he needed something, since he is the one who gives life, breath, and everything else. 26 From one person God created every human nation to live on the whole earth. having determined their appointed times and the boundaries of their lands. 27 God made the nations so they would seek him, perhaps even reach out to him and find him. In fact, God isn't far away from any of us. 28 In God we live, move, and exist. As some of your own poets said, 'We are his offspring.' 29 "Therefore, as God's offspring, we have no need to imagine that the divine being is like a gold, silver, or stone image made by human skill and thought. 30 God overlooks ignorance of these things in times past, but now directs everyone everywhere to change their hearts and lives. 31 This is because God has set a day when he intends to judge the world justly by a man he has appointed. God has given proof of this to everyone by raising him from the dead."
