# Edgcumbe Presbyterian Church Midweek Update February 8, 2023


*In this issue:* What If, Liberia Presentation, Glorian Service, Baby Shower, Feb. Mission



As you've probably noticed, one of my favorite questions for myself and others is, What if? The speculative and experimental form of the question gives our minds and hearts a little extra wiggle room to try out a new idea, that we otherwise might reject out of hand. Let's try this method with the four statements that we tried out of Sunday. The invitation here is to pick one of two of these options and try it on for size in a real moment or situation in your life today. If it leads to a new insight or possibility or a bit more peace–great! If it doesn't lead to any change at all–nothing lost. Here they are.

What if it's true that everything is either an expression of love or a call for love? What if it's true that there is only one will? What if it's true that there is no order of difficulty in miracles? What if it's true that Christ is the how?

Here's a little example. Let's say I have an article to write for the church newsletter. And then say I choose the fourth wondering, What if Christ is the how? I sit back for a moment to let that question settle inside of me. Then I say to Jesus, "OK, you write the article." Nothing happens. So I sit back again and let the question sink a little deeper. Then I say to Jesus, "Will you please accompany me as I write this article? I'll do the typing, but you fill my heart and my mind and my fingers. Let's do it together." What happens then. Well, this article happens; my life with Jesus at my side happens; an expansion of my heart happens. I begin to think of the rest of the day differently. Right after this, I'm going to visit Lynn Wolf in the hospital, and now I know in the depths of myself that Christ is going with me and leading me. I don't need to worry about what to say or how to feel. Christ is the how.
