# seeing our blindness...

this past weekend, we looked again at the john 9 text to unpack even more goodies within the story of the man born blind. first we saw jesus' unwillingness to label neither man nor his parents as ones who sinned, who "caused" the blindness. "this happened," jesus responds to his disciples, "so that god's mighty works might be displayed in him." i am learning and beginning to see how constant and unconscious my own impulse to assess/evaluate/judge.... everything!! and jesus reframes the situation— what if there is no one at fault? we begin to see that our need to assign blame is so instantaneous and insidious!! the most important lesson i am being invited to practice is to ask the holy spirit to re-interpret and re-purpose everything that i see, as well as everything that i believe has ever happened to me. when i step back from the one who ascribes meaning, it allows the holy spirit to let me see something from christ's eyes.

another piece of the story is the way sight and blindness interplay with each other. Recently, i have found myself in a similar situation as the pharisees in the story—"surely, we aren't blind, are we?" i was having a reaction to a situation, and as soon as i assured myself that i was seeing it all correctly, i felt the immediate niggling, telling me, "do you?????" the tricky thing about seeing things from an ego (separate-self) perspective, is that we always believe we are seeing rightly. however, jesus' words here are pointing to another reality—"that we say, 'we see', our sin remains." meaning, the moment we are convinced in our seeing, we have become blind. our work is recognizing and seeing when we are blind, so that, again, we turn to the holy spirit and ask to see with christ's vision.

where are you today? what is a situation where you are telling yourself that you are seeing rightly? where do you recognize that you are, in fact, blind? i invite you to observe yourself with curiosity and compassion. and, bring your learnings to your daily lenten practice, and simply rest in your at-one-ness with god.

#### <u>lenten spiritual practice of coming into this present now moment:</u>

- 1. come into presence with breath. notice your inbreath.
- 2. accept the at\*one\*ment with god (say: "i am at one with god")
  - 3. allow yourself to rest in this oneness for five minutes.
