On Sunday, I heard Pastor Luna suggest that I may benefit from reconsidering how well I know who it is that I am. When I attempt to describe to others who it is that I am, I usually begin with who it is that I have in my life (Lisa, kids, grandkids, etc.), then I add a list of things that I do (my work, the groups I belong to, my hobbies, etc). Describing who's around me and what I do doesn't describe who I am. Yet if I'm honest with myself, it is this description that I rely upon in deciding my worth and whether I belong. Further clouding my vision is broken thinking that keeps me shackled to shame.

The scriptures (Romans 8:26-39) that Anna and Dean shared says, "We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn within a large family." This makes alive in me that I am one of God's children and I have a very large family. God has always known who I am AND who I am becoming. This folds time in on itself in a way that includes all my regrets and the parts of me I seek to hide and believe separate me. Safely in the fold of God's family, I can trust my future to unfold in ways that lead to full joy, empowered purpose, and unshakeable belonging. When I rest in God's reassuring "I know you and I've got this," I am set free from clinging to my shame and begin to see the truth...that God uses all of it, the good, the bad, and regrettable, to fulfill God's intention in creating a beloved child named Jay (insert your name here).
