

<u>Reflections from Pastor Phil</u>

On Luna's and my trip to Canada, I learned a few life lessons that I talked about this past Sunday.

- <u>DON'T BE AFRAID TO BE A LITTLE CRAZY</u>. We were trying to end up in Prince Albert Saskatchewan for an Enneagram Prison Project class. The day before we left, we decided to add an extra 1200 miles to our trip and go to the Canadian Rockies. Spending time in the mountains was so worth the extra time and driving. Is there something in your life or in the life of EPC where you are being called to go beyond the reasonable expectation and dream bigger with God?
- <u>A LITTLE DISORIENTATION IS GOOD FOR THE SOUL</u>. While in Canada we needed to adjust to dozens of small changes: Kilometers not miles, French on the signs, different people and languages and cultures. When things are different then we are invited to see new things, to notice different people, to be reminded that reality is not set in stone but is what we make of it. We can ask ourselves, **Am I being asked to change something in my daily routine or in my thinking to make room for something new?**
- <u>SOMETIMES A LOT OF DISORIENTATION IS GOOD FOR THE SOUL</u>. Teaching in the Pine Grove jail was hard and often disheartening. We had a great class, but the penal system in Canada is as stressed as the penal system here in the US–with epidemic staff shortages, overcrowding, legal hurdles, inhumane living conditions, rampant mental health and addiction issues, etc, affecting every inmate. In the midst of these profound structural challenges, the women in our class showed up with as much grace and willingness and hope as they could muster. It was truly inspiring. They reminded me that essential goodness in every human being goes deeper than any challenge or hurt or

injustice or trauma or story. Are you experiencing a profound reorientation right now–sickness, grief, injustice, change of circumstance, new insight, forgiveness opportunity? **Am I willing to surrender my anxiety to God and follow the leading of the Holy Spirit, trusting that the Spirit's way leads to peace?**

<u> Pastor Phil Returns to Pine Grove Jail</u>

The Enneagram Prison Project course that Phil started at Pine Grove jail in Prince Albert, Saskatchewan two weeks ago finishes up this week. Phil will be flying to and from Saskatoon on Tuesday-Friday. Let us keep Phil, the co-guides and the women of the class in our hearts and prayers this week!

<u> 2024 Pledges - Please turn in as soon as possible</u>

Thank you to everyone that has already turned in their pledge card. If you have not had a chance to turn in your pledge, please see the note below from Treasurer Ron Eggert and turn in the collection plate this Sunday. Thank you!

Session is asking our members to pledge early this year. EPC is facing a significant budget shortfall in the next calendar year. The shortfall comes about because the St. Paul Conservatory is moving into a permanent home elsewhere and because of reduced pledges due member deaths during this past year. If expenses and income in 2024 are equal to 2023, the shortfall will be around \$30,000 or about 1/6th of our total budget. The reason for the early pledge request is so Session will know how much income we will have and will have an extra month to consider alternatives. (We do have a small reserve fund but I think it would be imprudent to use it to fill a budget gap: it is meant for emergencies). If we do need to cut back next year, it will likely be in personnel as building costs are fixed. <u> October Mission - Peace and Global Witness</u>

October Mission: Peace and Global Witness Offering

At Edgcumbe, the Mission Team for 2023 designated 100% of October's mission gifts to the international effort for peacemaking and reconciliation at PCUSA {Presbyterian Church USA}. We'll share stories of the many efforts here in the newsletter and with moments for mission in worship.

One focus this year is on the upheaval of climate change in the South Pacific Islands and the resulting forced migration from family farms in the low-lying islands. On some islands, as many as 45% of residents have been displaced. This migration means families that lived for generations on the islands are moving both inland and to other islands that increasingly have food and shelter shortages, as well as no way to grow sustaining crops.

The Mission Agency of PCUSA has international and domestic peacemakers {such as Maina Talia below} working with displaced islanders and their neighbors, who often resent the migration of those displaced. He is successful in securing early warning systems for cyclones, hurricanes and tsunamis, and working to increase food and shelter in the Islands.
