What fun we had this past Sunday with our Brunch & Artists worship service. Thank you so much for everyone who brought food and to Sarah Gannett and Dave Howe-Vielmetti for sharing your art and your hearts with us.

I took home a key learning from each of our artists that I want to reshare here.

- Sarah made a gorgeous quilt for us from the scraps leftover from Carol Schweickhardt's quilt fabric. For Sarah, this quilt is not just meant to dazzle the eye but used as a blanket of healing and comfort for all who mourn or are hurting in any way. Junk scraps made into healing and comfort. That feels like God's math; and leaves me with the question: Are there people or areas in my life that I have assigned to the scrap heap who could actually be a source of beauty and healing?
- Dave has been sharing a few of his photos with us on the sanctuary walls for several weeks. On Sunday, Dave said that in order to take meaningful photos he needs to let go of his preconceived notions and simply notice the world around him. Then he added, "I need to stop thinking." Oof. Do you want meaning and connection and creativity in your life? Try this: stop thinking; start trusting. See what happens.

It's Thanksgiving tomorrow. We've all been doing this for so long that we could make Thanksgiving dinner in our sleep. So stop thinking and start noticing. Notice the junk scraps, notice the beauty, notice the need for comfort and healing. There's so much to be grateful for.
