

being out of the world's mind...

over this past year, our scriptures have been inviting us to undo our images and beliefs about ourselves: we are not bodies; we are spirit; we are in the world but not of the world. this past sunday's passage from mark 3 goes even further by showing that to be in the christ mind, the world will see this perspective as being "out of our minds."

Undoing the ego thought system requires nothing less than the reversal of the thinking of the world.

when we orient from a perspective of separation (which is the ego's thought system), we inherently live in fear-both consciously and (mostly) unconsciously. does this match for you? i am sure we can all name those places where fear

resides within us, but can you just pause and be curious: could there be even deeper fear and anxiety under what i know? what does the still small voice within you have to say?

see!! already, these invitations seem ridiculous to the world's wisdom. why would you want to actually acknowledge and feel our fears, says the world. just put on a happy face. a strong face. an i've-got-this face. the reason why these invitations are crucial is because jesus himself tells us he came so that we might have *life abundantly*. he does not mean that we are abundant with material items. he means that we might be able to live in the kingdom while we live in the world.

jesus' own biological family and the religious leaders of his day tried to disown him by claiming he was "out of his mind" and that "he's possessed by beelzebub." we will not be shown the path to death and resurrection from the world, but only by following jesus. we cannot walk this path alone. we need each other. there is something revolutionary and rebellious **to choose connection and joining**. and we are reminded that this path of following jesus is not simply a slight correction from the world's wisdom, but is, in fact, **a complete reversal of the world's**

perspective and thinking. we find our path by offering our consent and desire to holy spirit, and asking that she repurpose every situation for god's will. i invite now to pray with me in this moment, (**taking a breath**):

holy spirit, in this holy moment, you be in charge, and we will follow you, trusting that your direction leads to peace.

We are changing our summer worship plan just a bit for the coming months and adding a Pancake Breakfast. We are also hosting two other congregations—what fun! Here is the current schedule:


- June 16 Hymn Sing (Jenya's last Sunday for two months
