Reflection Article

On Sunday, our scripture reading was Mark 4:35-41. I spoke of how I could relate to the apostles' fearful reaction to waves washing over the side of their boat as Jesus slept through a squall. Just hours earlier they had watched with the crowd that had gathered beside the lake as Jesus taught the parables of the sower, a lamp on a stand, the parable of the mustard seed, and the parable of the growing seed. Then, when he was alone with the disciples, he explained the parables. The parable of the growing seed, Jesus explained, is what the kingdom of God is like. "A man scatters seed on the ground. Night and day, whether he sleeps or gets up, the seed sprouts and grows, though he does not know how."

...Whether he sleeps or gets up, though he doesn't know how. These should be reassuring words that stay with me. I'm imagining that the disciples had felt Jesus' words resonate within them and that they were stirred by an intuitive recognition, an inner knowing that they were in the presence of truth personified. I'm reading an account of His words that day and my heart is stirred. Imagine standing on the shore of that lake, seeing his face, feeling the sunshine and the wind off the lake. Then, just like the disciples experienced that night in the middle of a dark lake, life gets scary, waves start to wash over the side of my boat, and I find myself at the end of myself, and I forget how the kingdom works! I forget that God has made me and, though I don't know how, God is going to bring growth, and with time, fruit from what seems like death.

It is reassuring to know that Jesus has invited me to bring my forgetfulness to God. In the Aramaic reading of "And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil," Jesus teaches us to pray saying in Aramaic, "Wela tahlan I'nesyuna Ela patsan min bisha," which in English we can hear, "Don't let us enter chronic forgetfulness of soul and source. On the contrary, release us from acting unripely, not in tune with our self's healthy purpose."

I am grateful to be part of a community that reliably reminds me what the Kingdom is like!
