freedom in not knowing!

it was such a joy this past weekend to immerse ourselves in the story of solomon (2 Kings 2 & 3), who pleased god, so god told him to "ask for whatever he wished". anything!! and how does our brother solomon respond? "...i know next to nothing...please give your servant a discerning mind in order to govern your people and to distinguish good from evil, because no one is able to govern this important people of yours without your help." wow!! solomon saw that he knew next to nothing, he admitted out loud, and then what he wanted was **help from god!** when he came to the cliff edge of himself, he showed us that freedom and wisdom comes from god! thank you, solomon, for sharing this surprisingly contemporary story with us!! by coming to the end of ourselves, we follow jesus in dying to ourselves. and, in the words of the prayer attributed to saint francis: **it is in dying that we are born to eternal life!**

so, knowing that turning to god is helpful, but it is a different matter to actually embody and practice it. one way to practice this surrender is through the welcoming prayer. we often have habitual responses to life and stress—to worry and be anxious, to try to exert control and power, to reach for approval and affection. finally, we admit to ourselves that our responses do not lead us into peace. so, we ask ourselves: what do we really want? we want the peace and wisdom of god. our impulse will be to effort ourselves into this peace, but the path is actually to welcome whatever is front of us, knowing that it is for our healing. we turn to god, asking to be released from our ways, and for god's ways to be ours.

The Welcoming Prayer

Welcome, welcome, welcome.

I welcome everything that comes to me today because I know it's for my healing.

I welcome all thoughts, feelings, emotions, persons, situations, and conditions.

I let go of my desire for power and control.

I let go of my desire for affection, esteem, approval and pleasure.

I let go of my desire for safety and security.

I let go of my desire to change any situation, condition, person or even myself.

I open to the love and presence of God and God's healing action within.

what is troubling you right now? if you were honest with your self, where is the pain? are you willing to stand with solomon and admit that you know next to nothing about whatever this is? i invite you to move into a time with the welcoming prayer.....gently breathe into the prayer right now, coming into presence with your physical self, and taking a moment to really land in the present moment. allow yourself to admit that you don't know what this is for. consider slowing on the words in the welcoming prayer that need time and space....what do you notice?

dear ones, our freedom lies at the end of ourselves. and, i want freedom for myself and you and for all—and i will hold this in my prayers for you! may the light of christ be our path!!

holy spirit, in this holy moment, **you** be in charge, and we will follow **you**, trusting that your direction will lead us to peace!!

<u> Backwoods Focus For August: Weeds & a Dead Hedge!</u>





Luna and I (Phil) and our son Micah have been busy this summer in the Backwoods pulling invasive species, clearing fallen tree branches, and other general tasks. With all the rain this year, the one area where we are woefully behind is keeping the stations and mediation pathway

clear of weeds. Thank you to those of you who have been able to offer some time toward this monthly focus. Also, Micah and I installed



a parallel line of posts along the south edge of our meditative pathway over the past two weeks [see photo]. We hope to fill this 24" gap with cut and fallen trees and branches from all over the property, thus creating a "dead hedge." Although it sounds a bit macabre, we hope to create both a sight barrier from our neighbors and a habitat for local wildlife.
