Three-Centered Trust

On Sunday, we remembered together that the whole Bible is about entering into a relationship of trust—with the Spirit, with each other, with ourselves. Such trust invites into the miracle of the timeless Now. The Bible uses countless metaphors to try to describe what it feels like to live in deep trust in the present moment. Here are some examples off the top of my head. It's like...

- Falling in love (Song of Solomon)
- A bird finding a safe nesting spot (*Psalm 84*)
- A drop of honey on the tongue (Ps 119, Rev 10)
- Siblings getting along with perfect harmony (*Psalm 133*)
- Every perfect gift that comes from God (James 1)
- A treasure that you find unexpectedly in a field (*Matthew 13*)
- Water for the thirsty, food for the hungry (*Everywhere*)
- Being born again (John 3)

Does one of these metaphors inspire you or pique your interest? Let your imagination play with image and see what emerges for you.

The second point we talked about was that trust is always a "Three Centered" experience. In other words, it is never just a mental idea (Head Center), nor only an emotion (Heart Center), nor limited to what we do (Body Center). Trust is always grounded in the flow between all of these Centers, all of our ways of knowing. In this sense, trust is *experiential*. How do we know that we are moving into trust? Because it changes our thinking, because we feel like a new person, because we act differently in our relationships. Although it seems scary; it is actually delightful and life-giving—return to the above metaphors, if helpful.

How do we begin trusting? By beginning to trust!! Yes, it's that easy and that hard. Almost always in my experience, when we begin to step toward trust, one of our three Centers will rebel. During worship, I felt my feet rebelling ("You are not going anywhere," they said to me.) Sometimes our heart rebels, usually with either an overwhelm of feelings or maybe a disassociation from our feelings. Or our head rebels: "Do you have proof that God even exists? I thought not." All of these are ego-strategies designed for us to give up trust and rely on our own ego to protect us. "You can only trust me," is one of our core inner ego-messages.

My first invitation to you all was to sit with one of the above metaphors and see if maybe one of them sparked a renewed willingness to explore trust in your life. The second invitation is to ask yourself: Where do you experience resistance to trust? If you become aware of resistance, don't try to banish it. Simply notice it, welcome it, see what it has to say. Take a breath or two around the resistance, allowing all three of your Centers to come online. See if the Spirit or your own heart is saying something beyond the resistance. Take a step.

holy spirit, in this holy moment, **you** be in charge, and we will follow **you**, trusting that your direction will lead us to peace!!
