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#### **Choosing Trust**

"By faith they crossed the Red Sea as if they were on dry land, but when the Egyptians tried it, they were drowned." Hebrews 11:29.

Last week Pastor Luna reminded us that we cannot trust something we are afraid of. She added that: "whenever we are in fear, or reaching for control, or caught in shame—beneath it all our fear is pointing us to places where we do not have trust." So many of us learned in childhood that the world is a fearful place, where we don't feel safe or seen or free. In such an environment, it makes sense to withhold our trust until a person or situation has proved their trustworthiness. Life becomes a constant test: Can I trust this person? Is this group safe enough for me? Will this person betray or hurt me? Will I ever belong?

Hebrews 11 suggests a very different approach to life. Hebrews says that faith (trust) is not earned but chosen. Ponder that for a moment. Imagine a life where you choose to trust. Here are two examples.

Example One. In Hebrews 11, it says that the Hebrew slaves fleeing Egypt crossed the Red Sea because they chose trust. They were caught between the sea and the Egyptian army. Destruction and re-enslavement seemed assured. Nothing in their experience would suggest that walking into the sea would save them. But they did it. They trusted, they took the first step, and they were saved. The Egyptian army had a very different experience. They had just seen the Hebrews cross the sea unscathed. "We don't need to trust," they must have thought. "We have confirmed with our own eyes that this is safe!" And they drowned.

Example Two. Every time I walk into a prison or jail, I consciously choose trust over fear. There are plenty of uncertainties and possible dangers in prison. By choosing trust, two things happen. One, rather than being guarded and fearful, I go into every interaction with an open mind and an open heart. That changes things. Two, I am reminded about what is most-real—that every person is a divine spark loved by God forever. That changes things too.

Now the question is for you. What happens for you when you choose trust. Try it and pay attention. Walk into a coffee shop choosing trust. Show up at church choosing trust. Be more

honest than you usually are and choose trust. Call someone you haven't talked to in a bit and choose trust. Can you feel the difference? That's the difference between living and drowning.

holy spirit, you be in charge, and we will follow you, trusting that your way leads to peace.

# <u>Shiloh's Scriptures from the Prayer of Honesty this past Sunday</u>

After Sunday's Prayer of Honesty, some people asked Shiloh to share the scripture passages he used. Here is what he passed along:

**James 4:11-12** "Do not speak evil against one another, brothers. The one who speaks against a brother or judges his brother, speaks evil against the law and judges the law. But if you judge the law, you are not a doer of the law but a judge. There is only one lawgiver and judge, he who is able to save and to destroy. But who are you to judge your neighbor?"

This verse is a reminder that judgment is a role reserved for God alone. When I judge someone else whether in thought, tone, or behind closed doors I'm stepping into a role I was never asked to fill. It's almost like I'm trying to rewrite God's law by acting like I know someone's full story or heart. But only God can see the whole picture, the heart behind the choices. Judgment is the weapon I would use against myself. Love sees beneath the irritation and the judgment, When I judge others, I block the flow of healing for them, but also for myself.

**1 Corinthians 12:12-14** "Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body... even so the body is not made up of one part but of many."

Paul reminds us that we're all deeply connected under Christ. Different roles, different expressions, different journeys but one Spirit. It's not just poetic it's literal in the Spirit. If I harm or dismiss someone else, I'm hurting myself, because we're spiritually intertwined. When you meet anyone, remember it is a holy encounter. As you see him, you will see yourself.

**Matthew 7:1-2** "Judge not, that you be not judged. For with what judgment you judge, you will be judged; and with the measure you use, it will be measured back to you."

Jesus cuts to the heart here, judgment boomerangs. What we put out into the world spiritually, especially in how we evaluate or diminish others, returns to us. Not as punishment, but as a mirror. It's not just about being nice. It's about cultivating a way of being where love is the standard we measure by. You cannot be attacked, attack has no justification, and you are responsible for what you believe. When we shift how we see others, we shift how we experience God's kingdom.
