Wow! My heart is so full from our Sunday together!! ♥ So much joyful life within the Edgcumbe Community!! ♥ Thank you to each of you for the ways you showed up and shared in the life of the community so fully!! What we are doing here is being the Living Body of Christ, re-minding us how we are the Light of the world and living out Jesus' teaching of loving God, loving neighbor, and loving self!

After Sunday, new member Rachel Swan wrote to the Belonging Team (who organized the Cookie Sharing) this email:

I want to share something my friend said on a post I made about joining EPC. She is a long time episcopal friend and former colleague.

She said "Welcome "home" Rachel! The Edgcumbe community will be blessed. And I am profoundly thankful you continue to honor the longing in your soul."

I was struck by her using the word longing. I couldn't help hearing the word and then adding to it to become be-longing. That is what is true for me today. The words, the connections

being made, it's all such a gift. I feel, we both—ratchet and me—feel like we belong.

Thank you for welcoming me, and for being a part of my own be-longing. Today felt a little like heaven to me.

I am so profoundly struck by the truth in Rachel's reflection....that our lives can be shaped by a nameless and profound sense of longing, which can leave us restless and filled with a sense of dis-ease. And that something profound and healing occurs when we experience **be-longing**. And I am noticing the "be" part of this word...that coming into presence—with an open heart, a quiet mind, and a grounded body—allows us to be in the moment of Now so that we have the capacity to be-long.

We can think that we are inherently the body of Christ, but it is only when we **have a felt experience** of it does that become transformative and healing. And so we continue to surrender to Holy Spirit, and ask Her to move within and amongst this Edgcumbe community so that we can know Immanuael–God is with us!!

Holy Spirit, in this holy moment, you be in charge, and we will follow you, trusting that your direction leads to peace!!

Community Spiritual Discipline for January 2026: A Word from Elder Chelsea W.

30 Day Meditation Challenge- begins Jan 1st!

Hello Edgcumbe family! This is Chelsea W. speaking.

I hope you join us for a transformative 30 days of deepening into self awareness, presence, and embodiment, starting Jan 1st. A couple things to note about this meditation series:

1) I created it for a wide and diverse audience, so there is not any specific "Christian language" used. However, this does not mean that this is a secular practice! The daily discipline of cultivating Presence within our bodies, hearts, and minds is inherently spiritual. It is another form of deep, experiential prayer. When we are Present, we come into contact with The Presence (of God), and we deepen that relationship, as a practice of building Trust through direct experience and contact. As summed up beautifully by G.I. Gurdjieff, "Unless we are present, we cannot pray. When we are present, we *must* pray."

2) These practices are not "woo woo," esoteric, or "far out." They are a practical, down-to-earth approach to building skills in re-training our minds (*metanoia*). Redirecting our Attention, learning to feel the body, and skillfully opening our hearts to give and receive are skills that can be learned with the right tools, guidance, and dedicated practice. *Anyone* can do this!
