- 5 The light shines in the darkness,

No matter where you find yourself in this difficult and chaotic time, I encourage you to find space for quiet and stillness. Light a candle to remind you of God's presence. Pray for all those affected by this horrific and senseless violence. Breathe in the love God has for you. On Sunday we will tell the story of Jesus' baptism, the Holy Spirit descending like a dove and the voice of God saying that Jesus is God's own beloved child. In our life of faith, we are most prepared to live out our calling when we remember that we are loved for who we are, separate from anything we have done or failed to do. It is this place of belovedness that grounds us for a life that leads to connection and peace, a life that enables us to give good gifts to our neighbors.

I'm trying hard not to despair and not to give in to the rage that rises within me when I hear the rhetoric about ICE being here to bring peace to our community. I invite you to join me in being careful about what we read and watch. Time for quiet reflection and being present to those who need us is just as important as reading the latest update. Please join me in praying for our immigrant neighbors, those who are grieving, and for all in positions of leadership who must navigate yet another crisis in our city and state..

May God give us grace to live through these challenging days and to be part of the Spirit's

resistance which practices joy and refuses to let the enemy rob us of the gift of daily life and light. Peace to everybody everywhere..
