Pastors' Report

Routinely, as Luna and I check in after worship or Bible study or Centering Prayer or countless other EPC encounters, we say to each other, "How did we get so lucky to work in such an amazing community?" That is the heart of this report: Edgcumbe Church is an amazing community filled with kind and honest and generous and supportive people seeking to follow the Holy Spirit together. Here are some memories and reflections from 2024, in no particular order.

Todd Barnes died in early April, almost exactly a year after Carol's death in 2023. We gathered in his hospital room to pray and cry together, and then we planned his memorial service in one of Todd's favorite spots, the EPC backwoods. Todd was so full of life and vigor and passion and

humor, and he affected our community in so many ways, that it is hard to imagine him gone. As with Carol and every important death in our community, we laugh and cry and mourn, and we remember in faith that nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus. Carol and Todd were both spark plugs in our community, so their passing makes room for new sparks and new plugs!

Officially (see their report below) EPC Mission giving in 2024 was \$18,200. Because I know of some gifts that were inspired by EPC, my own figure for EPC mission is closer to \$30,000. Five years ago, in 2019 our Mission giving was \$2200. That's a fifteen-fold increase! That's a tithe (tenth) of our whole budget. That's biblical-level giving, and it's inspiring and heart-warming and hope-producing. Thanks be to God for your generous souls.

This past year has seen a resurgence in community-building activities, including a couple of backwoods campfires, church workdays, and a wonderful progressive dinner in December. This

feels like a lovely legacy of both Carol and Todd, who "spark plugged" this kind of connection for years.



In 2024, Luna attended her Nature Companionship training and Phil took two trips to Europe to do Somatic Enneagram training. I mention this so that you can see the kinds of training that your pastors are doing, but also as a celebration of a key value of this congregation: to continue to grow in our faith and our learning and in the capacity of our hearts to love and to heal.

Without making this report crazy long, let me add a few other quick reflections that seem self-evident to me, but may or may

not be to you. We have a committed and Spirit-filled Session, supported by the competence and care of our Stated Clerk and Treasurer, Ron Eggert. We have a great staff who are a pleasure to work with. Luna and I love you and feel your love and support in so many ways, as we seek to follow the Holy Spirit's lead together.

P.S. Here are two things that began developing in 2024 that will shape our community and spark possibilities moving forward:

- A bunch of new people are showing up! We have 13 people exploring membership this January/February 2025, and even children have recently graced our worship service.
- We received a gift of stackable purple chairs for our sanctuary this past fall, which adds to the flexibility of our sanctuary space. The sanctuary is now our only large "multi-purpose" space in the church. In recent years, we have heard ideas for our church around hosting dance church, yoga classes, healing services, local theater, more clothing exchanges and so on. I wonder if this is a year when we ask ourselves and the Holy Spirit if it's time to re-imagine this space and how it could be used.

Length of leave: 3 months; years of service required: 6 years. (Presbytery guideline is 3 months after 6 years of service.) Session approval of dates and plan required.

Parental Leave - When an installed teaching elder or spouse is to give birth, or to adopt a child, family leave shall be offered under at least the following terms: Eight weeks family leave at 100 percent of pro-rated annual salary and full housing allowance, or twelve weeks at 75 percent of pro-rated annual salary and full housing allowance. Personnel Report

Since the reactivation of the personnel committee in November, team members include Meredith Holt, LaGretta Lunde. Pastors Luna and Phil GebbenGreen.

The team recommended and Session approved a 5% raise for all staff for 2025, with gratitude for the dedication and gifts of all five staff members: Pastors Luna and Phil GebbenGreen, Music Director Jenya Trubnikava, Office Manager Krysta Niznick, and Custodian Sol Guevara. The committee also unanimously approved increasing vacation

time for Marisol Guevara, our custodian since 2008 from two to three weeks per year.

In early December, we recruited Edgcumbe congregant Jane Tafel to share her grant-writing expertise as we began the process of applying for a \$60,000 Lilly grant for our pastors' 2026 three-month sabbatical. The grant asks the question: "What Makes Your Heart Sing?" Our pastors have narrowed their answer down to "singing" and "nature." Currently, they are working with another talented grant writer from our congregation, James Witbrook, to finalize the specifics of their sabbatical.

At the same time, the personnel committee met with interested members of our congregation after church one Sunday to generate ideas for congregational activities and possible programming in our pastors' absence. We will be presenting a summary of those ideas during the annual meeting to seek more input and also ask for additional volunteers to help us begin planning for Sunday worship services during the sabbatical.

Building & Grounds

The B&G team is made up of Jay McGregor, Rich Schiferl, Ron Eggert, Dean Grussendorf and Pastor Phil. Activities focused on general building upkeep, repair and enhancements in order to be active stewards of the building and landscape. A few of the projects completed this year:



- 1. Repaired or replaced the three downspouts around the church building.
- 2. Replaced the rotten window sill under the office downspout (which we suspect led to basement leaking in past years).
- 3. Repainted the Preschool entry door and window frames and touched up education wing window frames.
- 4. Repainted the narthex bathroom.
- 5. Resurfaced the parking lot and driveway and striped the parking lines.

Our building and property continues to be used by multiple groups.

 Our relationship with the Saint Paul Conservatory of Music came to an end this past summer. SPCM is letting us use the small grand piano in the sanctuary for occasional recitals or concerts in the space.

- Rehoboth Evangelical Church continued to host worship services every Sunday for a small monthly fee.
- Highland AA hosts meetings in our space almost every day, plus quarterly speaker's meetings and the annual Gratitude meeting on Thanksgiving Day.
- We also hosted two outdoor concerts, the memorial service for Todd Barnes, and the many individuals and groups that enjoy our backwoods.
- This spring, over six different teachers from Highland Park Sr High School will use our library and parlor for a quiet spot to conduct their IB tests.

We have several projects on our scope for the coming year:

- A. New, non-carpet flooring for the Parlor.
- B. Exploring a "Bee lawn" in the church front yard. Look for a bee lawn tour this spring.
- C. Exploring costs and ideas for new windows in the church education wing.
- D. Exploring options to get water and electric power into the backwoods. Options for electricity include laying electric wiring or using a portable battery or quiet generator.

Backwoods Report

There have been developments over this past year in the Backwoods that can only be described as Celebrations!! A sampling would include:

- Very low occurrence of garlic mustard (meaning the mitigation efforts and work over the past 5+ years have come to fruition!!)
- Permanent seating (of recycled plastic) has been installed now at all 12 stations, and a full set of 8 permanent chairs are at the circle under the large maple.
- We have received the gifts of time and physical labor this
 past summer/fall from Micah GebbenGreen, who came in
 twice a week with a parent to do the various tasks of forest
 tending.
- During the summer, a small group of stewards met weekly for centering prayer and then tending to the care of the backwoods.
- We planted 3 oak trees in 2023, and even after intentional care, they died. However, this
 past spring one of the oaks came back to life with new growth!! A miracle and a
 resurrection!!
- HPSHS teachers have brought their entire class over to have class in the backwoods;
 other teachers use the woods for their own exercise and meditation.
- First time hosting concert space for Heartfelt.
- Nature experiences within worship.

We give thanks to the Holy Spirit for this extraordinary gift of being stewards of this land, and we continue to surrender it into HS's care for the work and ministry She desires for that area!!



Mission Report

2024 was another great year for EPC Missions. We are continually amazed and encouraged by the fantastic generosity of those who attend our small but mighty church. Team members are: Lisa Holden, Rich & Liz Schiferl, Ruth Anderson, Dave Howe-Vielmetti, and Pastor Luna.

Mission funds collection and distribution were over 70% above the total amount for 2023. The table below summarizes monthly collections and the groups we supported throughout 2024.

The total amount collected and donated in 2024 was \$18,221. For each dollar provided by Session for missions the congregation contributed \$7.44. Over 80% of the mission funds distributed to organizations went to local agencies in the Twin Cities. New for 2024 were three organizations: Enneagram Prison Project, Twin Cities Food Justice, and Neighborhood House. Also new this year was a backwoods benefit concert by HeartFelt which supported Voices of Hope and the Enneagram Prison Project.

In addition to the funds collected and distributed the EPC community continued to collect and distribute clothing for Joseph's Coat as well as stock food in our local food shelf in the EPC Narthex. We also

collected over 250 facial tissue boxes that were donated to the High School next door. Thanks goes out to all for your continued support of our Missions.

Music Report

I would like to begin this report with a heartfelt thank you to the EPC community for keeping the music program at EPC going. Your kind words, encouragement, ideas, donations and time are so appreciated and treasured. My special shout outs go to the talented, dedicated and hardworking members of the EPC choir. Their continuous professional growth, musicality, their aim for the better, their flexibility, grace and beautiful singing make me and the community so proud and grateful. The choir's weekly performing schedule was busy throughout the year and the repertoire reflected our constant development as the vocal group. The season culminated in Christmas Eve service, when our ensemble of 20 musicians welcomed 75 worshipers, performing the music of Quartel, Harmon, MacMillan, Wetzler, Rorem, and Vaughan Williams.



This year we welcomed Chelsea Witbrook as the new member of the choir, and Shelley Holden as the returning one!

With a broken heart we report the passing of our beloved Todd Barnes, the musician, composer, pianist, organist and overall amazing person. Todd's impact on this community is deep and will never be forgotten. We are so grateful to Todd for sharing his gift of improvisation, his passionate playing, his fearless preaching through music-making, his never ending support and

trust in the power of music. We had the honor of providing the music at Todd's memorial service and witnessed the overwhelming impact he had on so many lives. We love and miss you, Todd.

Big thank you to Ruth Andersen for sharing her musical gifts; to Jay McGregor for continuous technical support (and a debut duet singing!), and to the Session for the trust, encouragement and the choir's budget increase – this will allow us to explore/purchase more music and to continue hiring guest musicians, who bring so many gifts to our community. Small Groups

Two ongoing ministries are the Sunday evening Bible Study and the Tuesday afternoon Centering Prayer group. Both groups meet on Zoom with both regular attendees and new






participants and guests. We also had several backwoods campfire nights and a very successful progressive dinner in December.

Treasurer's Report

For the 4th consecutive year our income has equaled or slightly exceeded our expenses and there was a substantial carry-forward from 2024 into 2025. We ended 2024 with \$24,629 in our Associated Bank checking account (current expenses) and \$2,405 in the Associated savings account (savings for 2026 sabbatical). In addition, we have an emergency reserve at Vanguard of \$84,073, up from last year due to the stock market performance.

The 2025 budget is as lean as we could make it. Almost all of the expense side is devoted to staff salaries and building maintenance and operation. The Montessori Preschool income is contractual. The other income projections (AA and unpledged contributions) are conservative.

Thanks to all of you, our finances are stable and our expense projections for the 2025 budget are also conservative. The 2025 budget has been approved by Session. Approval of our pastors' compensation is on the Annual Meeting agenda. The budget is attached.
